



Background

Miss Mississippi's Outstanding Teen Organization was organized to encourage positive achievements by helping to nurture and build the scholastic achievement, creative accomplishment, healthy living and community involvement of our state's youth.

Among its initiatives, the Miss Mississippi's Outstanding Teen Organization hosts a state competition intended to encourage and reward the talent, communication skills, community service and academic achievement of girls between 13 and 17 years of age.

The Miss Mississippi's Outstanding Teen Organization has also established community-based initiatives and mentoring programs aimed at helping our state's youth build character and gain skills necessary for success in the real world. In partnership with committed adult volunteers, community and business leaders, as well as participants from the state competition, the Organization continues to implement programs aimed at helping young people develop strong values, leadership skills, social conscience, self-worth and conviction about their own potential.

The Organization's mentoring and community-based initiatives are available to all young people between the ages of 13 and 17. The Miss Mississippi's Outstanding Teen Organization awards scholarships to individuals on a basis of academic merit and civic and social achievement. Scholarships are awarded without condition or obligation to provide future services.

Funds raised by the Organization are being used to fund scholarships for deserving young women according to guidelines established by the Organization's Board of Directors in accordance with Internal Revenue Service rule and regulations. Funds are also being used to establish and develop the Organization's mentoring programs and community-based initiatives.

Becoming Miss Mississippi's Outstanding Teen

In order to become Miss Mississippi's Outstanding Teen a potential candidate must:

- Enter, compete and win a local, or "open/sweeper" local title. For specific information and deadlines for local competitions, including their dates and locations, please check the Miss Mississippi website.
- Once a local title is earned, the contestants begins the preparation process to compete for the title of Miss Mississippi's Outstanding Teen title.

The Role of Miss Local/State's Outstanding Teen

Miss Local/State's Outstanding Teen will have many roles during her year of service. She will represent her Local/State Organization, the National Miss America's Outstanding Teen Organization, the young women she competed with, and all young people her age, as well as promoting her chosen Social Impact Initiative and acting as an ambassador for the Miss America's Outstanding Teen Program. She must accept these responsibilities by always conducting herself in an "Outstanding" manner.

Miss Local/State's Outstanding Teen may be called upon to appear at a variety of functions throughout her state, where she will be asked to speak, possibly perform her talent, and interact with people of all ages. At all of these appearances, she must be gracious, well-spoken, attractive and well-groomed in an age-appropriate way, approachable and friendly in order to meet the public's expectation of a titleholder.

Phases of Competition:

Private Interview (30%)

Each Miss candidate will have a 9 minute and 30 second private interview with the judges. Each Teen candidate will have 8 minutes private interview with the judges. The judges will receive the candidates resume and social impact initiative (SII). The resume is similar to a work resume and is limited to two pages in length. The SII is a one page essay about the candidate's social impact projects. For this phase of competition, the candidate should wear interview attire.

Lifestyle & Wellness (10%)

This phase of competition is designed to see how well the candidate maintains a lifestyle of good physical health and whether or not she has the sense of confidence and self- assurance needed to serve as a titleholder. The candidate should demonstrate she takes care of herself and participates in activities which promote a healthy lifestyle. The candidates will wear a type of aerobic/active-wear clothing, chosen by the Local Organization, NOT a swimsuit.

Talent (40%)

Each candidate will have 90 seconds to present their talent.

Evening Wear/On-stage Question (20%)

This phase of competition is designed to assess the candidate's poise, grace, and commanding stage presence, as well as her ability to answer a question with eloquence and intelligence in front of a large audience.

General Information

Potential candidates should contact the local director of the specific competition the candidate is interested in competing in for general information regarding location, time, rehearsal, deadlines, production issues and photos.

Candidate Registration:

1. Each Teen Candidate will register once for the 2022 crowning year. [Click Here](#) for the Candidate Registration Link

 2. The registration process is completed when you pay \$35.
2. After completing Step 1, the Candidate will receive a receipt and the Miss Mississippi Office will receive the Candidate's information.
3. The Miss Mississippi Office will e-mail the Candidate a welcome letter along with a list of the local competitions that are scheduled.
4. To register for a local competition, use the [Candidate Local Competition Registration link](#) and pay \$75. (Only Miss candidates are required to pay the local competition registration fee. Teen Candidates please use discount code: TEENLOCAL.)
5. The candidate will receive a receipt and the Miss Mississippi Corporation will receive an e-mail confirmation that the candidate has paid to compete in the local competition.

Application Packet Instructions:

All forms MUST be typed

1. Local Contract

A parent or legal guardian must sign this contract. All candidates should read the local contract and have your parent or legal guardian read it as well.

2. Copy of Birth Certificate

You must include a copy of your birth certificate to verify your age.

3. 1 copy of Resume

The resume is similar to a work resume and is limited to two (2) pages in length. The copies will be given directly to the judges as you provide it to us. No changes will be made to the Resume you turn in.

4. 1 copy of Social Impact Initiative (SII)

The Miss America Organization, the Miss Mississippi Organization, and Local Competitions encourage the young women who participate in the program to become involved in the community, to develop a Social Impact Initiative, and to speak out on issues of concern to them, their communities, and to the nation. If you are selected as a local titleholder, you should have an issue to focus on during your Year of Service. Your SII is a one page essay about the candidate's social impact project.

5. Proof of Residence

To compete in this competition, you must have either:

- A. Lived in the state of Mississippi for at least six months prior to your entry into the pageant;
OR
- B. Must be presently enrolled AND be attending classes on a full-time basis at school in Mississippi for an open title;

You must be able to PROVE your residency with ONE of the following:

Driver's license, automobile registration, current lease, or other official document that establishes residency for six months prior to the date of the pageant. You may be asked to provide additional proof if you are selected as one of our local titleholders.

- Do not complete the Candidate # on any of the forms included.

Candidate number/competition order will be drawn by local committee in advance for production/printing purposes.

7. Picture You must send a 5"x7" COLOR picture with your completed application. Professional pictures are preferred. You should place a sticker with your name on the back of the picture if it is mailed. This picture will be used for the judge's book, and publicity.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR TYPING THE SOCIAL IMPACT INITIATIVE

Please remember. This is your opportunity to explain to the judges what your chosen platform (social impact initiative) is and why it is important for the local competition to embrace this platform. In addition, it should explain how your platform will further the Miss Local and the Miss Mississippi's Outstanding Teen "brand" to the public. This **ONE (1) page, single-spaced** document combined with the Candidate's Resume, will comprise your entire application for this job. **The judges will receive exactly what is submitted.** Any items, which do not meet the criteria or are submitted after the deadline, will not be given to the judges. The candidate may explain the lack of judging materials during her interview, if she so chooses.

Create a new document.

Set margins for 1" on all four sides. The font style may not be any smaller than "10" and no larger than "12" point type using the Times New Roman font style.

With the justification set for left, type "**Name:" in bold.** Following the colon (:), remove **bold** and hit the space bar twice. Then, type your name as you wish the judges to know it.

Double space down. Set your justification to "center". Then type in **bold and underline** the title of your Platform.

Double space down. With justification set for left and unbold, write what you feel is critical for the judges to know about your platform and why it is necessary for you to have the job of Miss Mississippi's Outstanding Teen to promote this issue. What you write will be what the judges know about your platform, your role in successfully dealing with this issue, and the role the Miss America's Outstanding Teen Organization may play in your plan.

Remember to include in the Platform Statement what **you** can do to get the message out and get more of your friends and other teens interested in Miss Mississippi's Outstanding Teen.

Remember to single space the text that you are typing.

This essay **may** include some of the following items (this is not to be meant as an exhaustive list):

A clear definition of the platform and the specific issues you wish to address

A plan on how you have or will create awareness of the platform

The way in which you have or will change attitudes regarding the issue

The way in which you have or will change behaviors related to this issue

The way in which your platform issue will move the Miss Mississippi Organization/MMSOT forward

Your media plans

Your marketing strategy

How you propose to fund your ideas/plans

Any significant accomplishments you have made in regard to your issue

At the bottom of the page. You **MUST** set the justification to the right. Type a line of 26 spaces. Below that line you must type Signature/Date. Once you have printed the document, you must sign and date this document.

For years, Miss America was seen as a young woman who cut ribbons and appeared in parades. It is time for "Miss America" to step out of the convertible and *lead the parade*. Our country's ethnic make-up is changing rapidly and our citizen's fear of terrorism can explode already existing, but deeply hidden prejudices. I want to be the leader that this nation needs.

This nation needs this issue addressed now and through the already existing NCCJ and its local and state organizations combined with the power of Miss America, we can make a concrete difference now, which will change the direction and the future of our nation.
