

To become a delegate for the next Competition Cycle (starting May 2023) you must meet all criteria as shown below:

- For Miss America birth years 1996 2006
- For Miss America's Teen birth years 2010 2006
- Be a United States citizen
- Be a female
- Meet residency requirements for competing in your city or state



As a Miss Mississippi delegate, you will be expected to advance your Community Service Initiative and serve as a brand ambassador for Miss America and the Miss Mississippi Organization, raising funds and awareness for scholarship.



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

Interview

30 sec. Opening | 9 min. Q&A | 30 sec. Closing Statement

Judges will determine delegate's ability to fulfill the qualifications, responsibilities, duties, personal qualities and attributes relevant to the titleholder position.



Performance Talent/HERstory

Up to 90 seconds

Judges will evaluate the delegate's commitment to performance arts education initiatives and women's individual efforts in dance, music, opera/vocal, drama, magic, oratory, circus arts and storytelling.



Evening Gown

Delegate will present her sense of style wearing an evening gown in a fashion suitable for an appearance as Teen/Miss Local. Part of a titleholder's role is to attend galas, fundraisers, awards shows, and other formal events. This often involves walking a red carpet, posting for the press photographers, modeling in fashion shows, promoting various national fashion designers who partner with Miss America or Miss America's Teen programs.



Health & Fitness

Delegates will compete in a high energy stage routine with movement and posing no longer than 20-30 seconds. This phase of the competition is where the delegate showcases her commitment to health and fitness initiatives, which is a key to success in all other areas of life.

On-Stage Conversation

The On-Stage Conversation will include five pillars of the brand (style, service, scholarship, success, sisterhood) and may include a "warm up" question. The delegate will have between 20 to 60 seconds to answer.

Registration

Registering to enter is a FOUR STEP process.

Step One: <u>Register</u> with the Miss Mississippi Competition.

Step Two: <u>Register</u> to become a member of the Miss America Organization for this year.

Step Three: Register for each individual local in which you choose to compete by contacting the specific Local Director.

Step Four: Submit the <u>Delegate Paperwork</u>.

• Fact Sheet

Candidates will submit a Fact Sheet. This, along with the CSI Statement, will comprise the entire application for this job. This Fact Sheet is an opportunity to demonstrate to the judges why they should consider a delegate for the job of Miss Mississippi. The judges will receive this document exactly as submitted.

• CSI

Miss America's Community Service Initiative (CSI) is an integral part of the interview phase of competition, supporting one of the branded elements of Miss America as outlined by the "Four Points" of the crown. The "Four Points" are Style, Scholarship, Service and Success. CSI is specific to the SERVICE point of the crown.

The CSI initiative allows you, as a participating delegate, to showcase and deploy your interests and creativity, to outline a plan or effort to engage existing programs within your local community or state. You may also design your own program for your community or state.

Must be a single page San serif fonts in sizes 11-14.

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The CSI initiative allows you, as a participating Delegate, to showcase and deploy your interests and creativity, to outline a plan or effort to engage within

This ONE page submission in san-serif font style of your choice, font sizes from 11-14 only, should include the following:


- A description of your Community Service Initiative passion or interest
- Why you chose this particular initiative
- How you've partnered or will partner with local/state communities to create momentum
- Any social media or marketing strategies that will best support your CSI
- Any activities you have planned or participated in with respect to this CSI

Use of Graphics

At the local level, you may use "header only" graphics approximately 1/2 inch from the top of the 8.5 x11 page. Graphics may include existing organizations' logos, taglines or other creative efforts. You may use bullet points within your long form essay. Your local/state organization may decide to have you submit your CSI single page electronically, via a form rather than a pdf, through a portal, or other options.

Signature and Date

Please sign and date your submission at the bottom right hand corner, and include your local title. No submissions to be verified without signature.
